Interim report Q2 January - June 2024

Continued growth in the quarter

April - June 2024

- Net sales amounted to SEK 89.6 (68.8) million, an increase of 30% compared to the corresponding period the previous year.
- Gross profit amounted to SEK 81.0 million (62.1), an increase of 31% compared to the corresponding period the previous year. Gross margin amounts to 90% (90%).
- EBITDA amounted to SEK -23.2 (-33.0) million.
- Operating loss amounted to SEK -64.2 (-70.7) million. Depreciation of the surplus value created in conjunction with the Affectiva and iMotions acquisitions amounts to SEK -29.2 (-28.8) million.
- Earnings after tax per share are -1.46 (-1.94), and after full dilution -1.46 (-1.94).
- Cash and cash equivalents totaled SEK 110.1 million at the end of June. The cash ending balance including credit facilities amounts to SEK 192.3 million.
- Strong order intake after the end of the quarter, SEK 700 million deal with Volvo Cars, Audi, Porsche, GM and a new European OEM, for 35 car models with a global Tier-1.

January - June 2024

- Net sales amounted to SEK 175.7 (133.2) million, which corresponds to an increase of 32%.
- Gross profit amounted to SEK 158.3 (116.7) million, an improvement of SEK 41.6 million compared to last year.
- Operating loss amounted to SEK -125.7 (-152.6) million. Depreciation of the surplus value created in conjunction with the Affectiva and iMotions acquisitions amounts to SEK -57.6 (-57.0) million.
- Profit/loss after financial items amounted to SEK -124.9 (-152.6) million.
- Earnings after tax per share are -2.99 (-4.26), and after full dilution -2.99 (-4.26).

Comments from the CEO

The demand for DMS and Interior Sensing is booming. Since the beginning of the year, we have been completely immersed in customer requests for our DMS and Interior Sensing products. We are just starting to see the results of these intense sales activities. An example is the orders we received after the quarter ended from Audi, Porsche, Volvo, GM and one more OEM through a global Tier-1. This is just one of the deals we have been working on, and we expect several more to be made public as we are entering this year's nomination season.

Our short and long-term revenue growth will follow our customers' ramp-up of car production, and we are focusing our efforts on securing future nominations from key customers. Additionally in Behavioral Research, adoption of advanced quantitative methods will further support the structural growth of our research products.

Automotive

Automotive grew with 66% in Q2. The nonlicense revenue is decreasing while the revenue from series production licenses is increasing. Especially Korea and North America had a strong growth in licenses. We are approaching the final stage of several large production programs, which means we will go more and more from project-based revenues to license revenues. This is of course positive for our overall revenue growth. However, it also means we might see a temporary dip in engineering revenue, right before the production licenses fully ramp up. We are currently delivering on multiple projects, and the delays that were so frequent during Covid are a thing of the past. The operating expenses rose slightly in Q2, mostly because of sales-related cost increases but also due to salary increases for the engineering team. We are confident that these sales-related investments are well timed and will produce a positive outcome in the near term.

Behavioral Research

The Behavioral Research business area grew with no less than 16%, picking up speed from last quarter and falling just shy of our record quarter in Q4 last year. We are increasing our market share in the research sector thanks to our comprehensive product offering, and that our strategy of long-term partnerships is proving to be successful. The business units are improving topline as well as keeping tight



cost control, making the achievement even more impressive.

Final Words

With a continuous solid profitable growth in Behavioral Research, our outstanding order stock, the current car industry program rampup and our 192 MSEK in cash and credit facilities gives us confidence to pursue our market leadership for the future, reach profitability next year and maintain a sound financial situation. The most important KPI:s for our Automotive business are the number of car contracts secured and the speed at which these models enter production. This quarter, we successfully increased the number of car models entered into production from approximately 50 to 60, boosted our license revenue, and continued to outpace our competitors in winning new business.

As Smart Eye's leading position solidifies, we should expect more consolidation within the fragmented market for Tier 2 Interior Sensing. After the dust settles, the companies left standing will be in pole position to invest in two exciting new frontiers; complete cabin monitoring and the measurement of health, wellbeing and fitness to drive. Expect Smart Eye to continue to lead the charge towards new life-saving innovations.

Estimated value of obtained design wins

As of the report for the third quarter of 2018, the company provides information on the estimated market value of obtained design wins at the time of publication of the report. The figures in brackets show the levels at the time of the publication of the preceding report, which in this case was May 14th, 2024.

The total estimated value of the company's 357 (322) design wins announced to date amounts to SEK 8,200 (7,500) million over a product life cycle.

If the company's system had been used in all car models on existing platforms by the 22 (21) car manufacturers with whom design wins have been communicated, the estimated value would amount to at least SEK 11,450 (11,450) million over a product life cycle.

The calculations have been made by the company based on OEMs estimated production volumes of car models. The production volumes may change due to changed conditions for life cycle estimates of the car platforms.

One of the main reasons for the large number of Driver Monitoring System (DMS) design wins that has been awarded during the last years is due to the legislation that is about to take effect in Europe. Advanced Driver Distraction Warning will be required for new type approvals starting July 2024 and as of July 2026 all new vehicle registrations will require the same technology. Given the length of an automotive development project most of the OEMs have been making their decisions during 2021 and 2022 to fulfill the legislation once it becomes effective.

The Group

Revenue

Second quarter 2024

Net sales for the period April to June 2024 amounted to SEK 89.6 (68.8) million, which is an increase of 30%. The growth is driven by Automotive, 66%, and Behavioral Research, 16%.

Net sales for the **Automotive** business area (Automotive Solutions and Fleet & Aftermarket) during the second quarter was SEK 32.9 million, compared with SEK 19.9 million in the second quarter of the previous year. The revenue increase is driven by continued high activity in customer development projects (NRE), and higher license revenue related to ramp up of car volumes.

For the **Behavioral Research** business area (Research Instruments, Media Analytics and iMotions) net sales during the second quarter amounted to SEK 56.7 (49.0) million. The growth is driven by iMotions and Research Instruments.

January - June 2024

Net sales amounted to SEK 175.7 (133.2) million, which is an increase of 32%.

Net sales for the **Automotive** business area (Automotive Solutions and Fleet & Aftermarket) was SEK 65.6 million, compared with SEK 33.6 million for the same period the previous year, corresponding to an increase of 95%. The growth is mainly driven by higher project revenue (NRE) and license revenue.

Behavioral Research business area (Research Instruments, Media Analytics and iMotions) net sales during the period amounted to SEK 110.1 (99.6) million, which is an increase of 11% compared to the corresponding period the previous year. Research Instruments and iMotions increased sales both to new and existing customers during the year.

Results

Second quarter 2024

EBITDA amounted to SEK -23.2 (-33.0) million. The improved result is driven by increased sales, SEK 18.9 million, offset by higher expenses, SEK -9.1 million. During the period the company's operational expenses have increased due to yearly salary review and sales activities.

The operating result for the second quarter totaled SEK -64.2 (-70.7) million. The depreciation of capitalized expenditures has increased over the years. Depreciation of the surplus value created in conjunction with the Affectiva and iMotions acquisitions amounts to SEK -29.2 million in the quarter.

January - June 2024

EBITDA amounted to SEK -46.2 (-77.2) MSEK. The improved result is driven by higher sales from both business areas, with an improved gross margin, SEK 41.6 million, offset by higher expenses, SEK -10.6 million, driven by one-time expenses in the first quarter, yearly salary review and less grants.

Operating loss amounted to SEK -125.7 (-152.6) million. Depreciation of the surplus value created in conjunction with the Affectiva and iMotions acquisition amounts to SEK -57.6 million.

Financial position

In addition to cash and cash equivalents of 110.1 SEK million, the Group has two unutilized bank overdrafts facilities of SEK 20 million and DKK 8 million and a credit facility of SEK 50 million. The total cash ending balance including credit facilities is 192,3 MSEK.

Cash flow during the quarter amounts SEK -51.1 million. During the quarter a minor amortization of a loan has been performed.

During the quarter, Smart Eye celebrated its 25th anniversary. In 1999, founder and CEO Martin Krantz, together with his father, Mats Krantz, registered the company that became the world leader in eye tracking.

Events after the end of the period

Smart Eye announced on 14th of August a 700 MSEK deal with Volvo Cars, Audi, Porsche, GM and one more European OEM. A new battery of 35 design wins is with a total of five different car manufacturers, including a European customer which will be sourcing Smart Eye's technology for the first time.

Parent company

Revenue

Second quarter 2024

Net sales for the period April to June 2024 amounted to SEK 47.8 (33.6) million, which amounts to an increase of 42% compared with the same period last year. The growth is mainly driven by Automotive but also Research Instrument shows good growth.

January - June 2024

Net sales for the period January to June 2024 amounted to SEK 99.0 (58.6) million. Growth in the period amounts to 69%, high growth both for Automotive and Research Instruments.

Results

Second quarter 2024

The operating result for the second quarter totaled SEK -43.7 (-49.5) million. The improved result is driven by higher sales, SEK 13.9 million, offset by higher OPEX, SEK -8.1 million. The expenses increase due to yearly salary review and sales activities.

January - June 2024

The operating result for the first two quarters totaled SEK -72.2 (-110.6) million. The improved result is an effect of higher sales and stable operational expenses.

Significant risks and uncertainties in summary

Operational risks

The business operations are subject to risk factors that could impact the company's commercial and financial position. The risks relate in part to development operations proceeding as planned and in part to the company's success in recruiting qualified personnel to the necessary extent.

Financial risks

A positive cash flow is essential for longterm investment in the competitiveness of the Group. Demand and production of car models related to the Group's design wins significantly impact the company's license revenues and ultimately when the company reaches profitability and a positive cash flow. The company is currently financed through share capital and credit pending a positive cash flow.

As sales increase, the company will face an increased currency exposure since most of the company's sales will be denominated in a currency other than Swedish kronor.

Market risks

Eye tracking is an emerging technology, whereby the company's products are currently used in behavioral research and as

integrated products in the automotive industry. Regarding the Automotive business segment, a delay or the non-materialization of a launch of eye tracking in the automotive industry could entail a risk of a lower-than-expected growth rate. The future growth rate is strongly connected to the introduction of legislation in the European Union. At the time of publishing this report there are no indications of a delay in this legislation.

In the Research business area, the biggest market risk is the availability of funding in the academic field. A general decline in funding could be partly offset by an increased penetration of the market as the presence of the group's technology is still emerging.

Transactions with related parties

Except for shared based incentive programs and intercompany transactions there were no transactions with related parties during the period.

Share Information

The Company is listed on Nasdaq First North Growth Market. Certified Advisor is Carnegie Investment Bank AB (publ.).

Number of shares

The number of shares as of June 30th totals 36,995,768.

Share-based incentive scheme

At the AGM 17th May 2024 it was resolved on the adoption of a long-term incentive program in the form of performance-based share options directed at employees within the Smart Eye group. The maximum number of performance shares will amount to 636,400.

The company has since before three current incentive programs adopted by the EGM 8th October 2021, the EGM 29th June 2022, and the AGM 2nd May 2023.

Dividend policy

The Company is in a development phase and any surpluses are scheduled for reinvestment in the Company's development. The Board is not intending to submit a dividend proposal.

Accounting policies

The interim report has been prepared in accordance with the Annual Accounts Act and the general advice and guidelines of the Swedish Accounting Standards Board, BFNAR 2012:1, Annual Reports and Consolidated Financial Statements (K3).

This interim report has not been reviewed by the company's auditor.

Signing of the report

The Board of Directors and the CEO assure that the interim report provides a fair overview of the Parent Company's and the Group's operations, position and results and describes the significant risks and uncertainties in the Parent Company and the companies included in the Group.
